The Sustainable Development Goals Secretariat

The Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) aimed to address issues that included eliminating poverty, hunger, disease, gender inequality and access to water and sanitation. The 17 Sustainable Development Goals carry on

the work initiated by the MDGs. Although the MDGs applied to developing countries only, SDGs apply to all UN member states universally. The SDGs are considerably more comprehensive and ambitious than the MDGs.



Parliamentary Taskforce on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):

- The 15th National Assembly of Pakistan has successfully constituted the "National Parliamentary Task Force on SDGs", comprising of 50 cross-party Members of the National Assembly.
- Members have voluntarily joined the Parliamentary Task Force in order to create a joint ownership of the National Assembly and Senate of Pakistan to have an oversight on international development commitments, enact and influence policies related to SDGs and build consensus on key challenges.
- The Task Force has been ensuring a regular parliamentary oversight, effective legislative inputs and meaningful representation in the House. Similar Task Forces are functional in the Provincial Legislatures of Pakistan.







































All-Party and Provincial Representation:

Parliamentary Taskforces on SDGs have been formed in all provinces, driving ownership of the development targets through respective Assemblies including Gilgit Baltistan (GB) and Azad Jammu Kashmir (AJK). This task was made particularly important in post-introduction of the 18th Amendment to the Constitution of Pakistan in 2010. An Allparty and All-Inclusive approach has been adopted while creating these Taskforces; enhanced minority representation, and gender equality are also key features. Currently the



Parliamentary Taskforce constituted 131 Members including Federal (50), Punjab (15), Sindh (12), Balochistan (14), Khyber Pukhtunkhwa (30), Gilgit Baltistan (11), and Azad and Jammu Kashmir (10).

Secretariat of Parliamentary Taskforce on Sustainable Development Goals:

The National Assembly of Pakistan has established an extraordinary benchmark for the international community by inaugurating the first of its kind, state of the art Secretariat of the Parliamentary Taskforce on Sustainable Development Goals. The Secretariat provides technical assistance and support to the taskforce members through research, data & evidence, communication, advocacy and media outreach.

KEY OBJECTIVES:

The premise of the Secretariat of the Parliamentary Taskforce on SDGs is based on the following objectives:

- > To provide technical assistance and data to taskforce members for effective representation, oversight, evidence-based legislation and representation.
- > To develop district-wise and constituency-wise, comparable data scorecards for each priority area in order to oversee implementation of SDGs
- > Identify and analyse SDGs legislative gaps to further legislative interventions
- > Promote parliamentary outreach and build partnerships on SDGs with all stakeholders
- The Parliamentary SDGs Taskforce, in collaboration with key stakeholders has developed a strategic framework articulating annual targets, focused work plans with clear goals and accountabilities concentrating on cross-sectoral priorities such as health, nutrition, WASH, education, gender equality, child rights and climate change. With the passage of time the list is expected to grow.
